## The Keynote Challenge

Traveling all the way from his home in Manila, Philippines to deliver this year's keynote address, pastor Ferdie Cabiling challenged his audience with a simple goal: *to follow the example of faithful leaders who have gone before us in a response to God's call to make disciples*. A disciple, himself, of the early campus ministries of Rice Brooks and Steve Murrell dating to the early 1980's, Cabiling knows firsthand of the life-changing influence that one missionary can have on the growth of God's Kingdom.

Years ago, as a college senior, Ferdie Cabiling got radically saved at Adamson University in Manila, Philippines. After University he went into the full time ministry where he was instrumental in birthing many campus ministries and churches in the Philippines and across Asia. He also helped lead *Youth on Fire*, a ministry that has reached thousands of students in his home country. He is currently helping to lead growing congregations in Manila with close to 10,000 students. After Cabiling concluded his message on Saturday night, more than 200 students responded to be reconciled to God and 117 were water baptised through the guidance of the staff and campus pastors from Every Nation Campus Ministries.

## Standing Room Only for Reformed Apologetics

### Student leaders eager to learn new approach for sharing the Christian Faith

He calls it an "integrated approach to understanding everything," and they came from all corners of the King's Park complex to learn how it works. At first, moving from room to room as their numbers swelled from 20 to 40 to 80... and beyond, the overflow crowd of 147 student leaders finally settled in the large hallway by the elevator. Many were leaning against the walls, shoulder to shoulder, and with others craning their necks to see the speaker. Donald Wilson Bush, a life-long Scots Presbyterian and a graduate of Reformed Theological Seminary, delivered his presentation while standing atop a blue swivel desk chair.

Bush, a general systems theorist, a writer and a global advocate for democratic causes, has been working on what he calls "Preferentialist Apologetics" for the past 17 years. He now travels among civic groups and university humanities departments giving lectures in favor of Judeo-Christian values, civility and peace in the Western Civic Tradition.
